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OVERVIEW

This three-day journey is designed as an invitation rather than an itinerary.

An invitation to pause, to look more closely, and to experience Western Australia through moments of stillness as much as movement. The route unfolds naturally—from open skies above the land, to quiet encounters with native wildlife, to island shores shaped by wind and tide, and finally to a harbour city where history and coastal life meet.

Each transition is gentle, allowing the landscape to guide the pace rather than the clock.

Perth reveals itself not through spectacle alone, but through balance. Wide horizons soften the city's edges; ocean light stretches the day; green spaces rise effortlessly beside urban streets. Over these three days, you are given time to notice how the land breathes, how the sea sets the rhythm, and how space itself becomes part of the experience.

This is a journey shaped by light, air, and openness—one that lingers quietly, long after you return home.

DAY 1

From City Streets to Open Plains

Leaving Perth behind, the landscape gradually opens into riverbanks, farmland, and eucalyptus woodland. The pace slows almost immediately — a quiet transition from city rhythm to Western Australia's natural cadence.

Caversham Wildlife Park | Australia Up Close

Set beside the Swan River, Caversham Wildlife Park is one of Western Australia's most respected wildlife sanctuaries.

Known for its open-range design and conservation focus, it offers visitors the rare opportunity to meet kangaroos, koalas, wombats, and native birds at close range.

The farm show reflects Australia's rural heritage — sheep shearing, working dogs, and stories rooted in the country's agricultural past. It's an introduction not only to animals, but to the culture shaped by this land.



Midland | Everyday WA Life

Midland, once an industrial railway town, has evolved into a lively community hub.

Here, lunch is enjoyed at leisure, offering a glimpse into local life — unhurried, sunlit, and grounded.



Northam | Gateway to the Sky

By afternoon, the journey reaches Northam, a historic town at the heart of the Wheatbelt. Famous for its calm air currents and expansive plains, Northam is regarded as one of Australia's premier hot air ballooning locations.

As evening settles, the town grows quiet. The open sky and stillness prepare you for the dawn experience ahead.



DAY 2



When the Land Wakes

Sunrise Above the Wheatbelt

Before daylight fully arrives, the journey continues into the open plains.

Hot Air Ballooning |

Floating Through First Light

As the balloon rises, the Wheatbelt unfolds beneath you — vast agricultural patterns painted in gold and green. Roads narrow into lines, farmhouses become dots, and the horizon stretches endlessly.

This is not an adrenaline experience, but a meditative one. The silence, broken only by the occasional flame, allows the sunrise to feel intimate and profound — a moment where the land reveals itself slowly.





Fremantle | Salt Air and Stories of the Sea

Returning to the coast, Fremantle welcomes you with heritage streets, limestone buildings, and ocean breeze. Once Western Australia's primary port, Fremantle carries layers of maritime history, now softened by cafés, markets, and harbourside life.



Fish and chips by the water is a local tradition — simple, iconic, and deeply tied to the city's identity.

The day concludes with a relaxed evening by the harbour, where the sea reflects the last light of day.





DAY 3

Island Smiles & City Horizons

Rottnest Island | Where Happiness Lives

A short ferry ride brings you to Rottnest Island — famous worldwide for its quokkas, often called “the happiest animals on Earth.” Friendly and curious, they have become global icons.

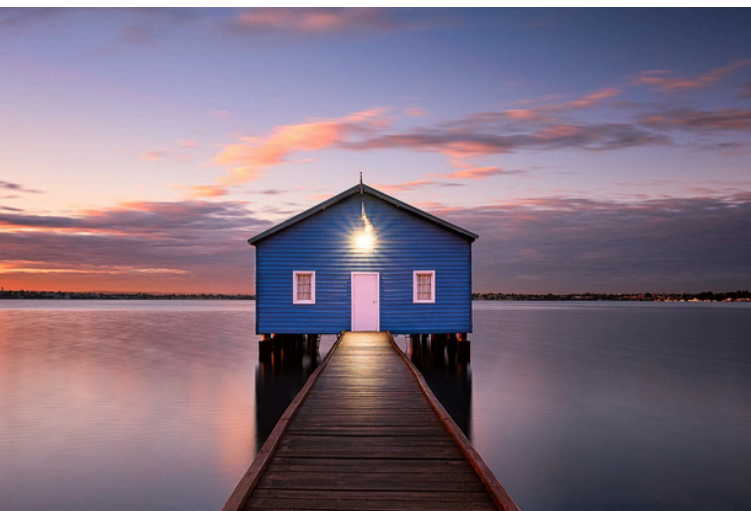
Yet Rottnest is more than its wildlife. The island holds deep Aboriginal history, colonial stories, and some of Western Australia’s most pristine bays. With no private cars allowed, the island moves at a human pace — by foot, bicycle, and sea breeze.



Kings Park | Above the City

Back on the mainland, Kings Park offers a sweeping view over Perth and the Swan River.

One of the largest inner-city parks in the world, it showcases native Western Australian flora and holds profound cultural significance for the Noongar people.



As the sun lowers, the city appears calm, distant, and beautifully framed.

Blue Boat House | A Gentle Farewell

The journey ends beside calm waters and soft light — a final moment to pause, reflect, and carry the landscape with you as you return to Perth.

Perth enjoys a Mediterranean-style climate, characterised by abundant sunshine, low humidity, and refreshing coastal breezes. Days are generally warm and bright, while mornings and evenings—especially near the ocean or on the water—can feel cooler, it is recommended to bring the following:

- 01** Lightweight outdoor clothing & slip-resistant shoes

- 02** Light jacket or warm clothing

- 03** Sunglasses and sunscreen

- 04** Reusable water bottle

- 05** Camera or mobile phone

- 06** Personal medications, sunscreen, and insect repellent

- 07** Personal toiletries and daily necessities

Kind reminder: The grounds often have stone slabs or grass surfaces, so comfortable and sturdy footwear is recommended; high heels are not advised.
