

DAY 1





Ocean Breeze & First Campfire

We set off from Perth CBD, where our friendly driver-guide greets you with a smile and a comfortable minibus ready to take you south. As the city fades into open road, the scenery transforms into wide golden fields, gumtree forests, and glimpses of the glittering Indian Ocean.

Busselton Jetty

After a scenic drive, Our first stop is the charming seaside town of Busselton, the northern gateway to the South West. Here lies Busselton Jetty, a 1.84-kilometre masterpiece of timber and history — the longest wooden jetty in the Southern Hemisphere.

Shelter Brewing Co.

Take a leisurely stroll along the boardwalk, breathe in the crisp sea air, or simply watch the waves lap gently against the pylons. For lunch, we'll enjoy a delicious meal at Shelter Brewing Co., Busselton's most celebrated beachfront restaurant and brewery.

The entire building is a modern industrial glasshouse — wide open spaces, soaring ceilings, and panoramic windows framing the Indian Ocean just metres away.

After lunch, we leave the ocean behind and journey into the heart of the forest, where the air grows cooler and the scent of eucalyptus thickens. Depending on group size and availability, we will stay at Potter Gorge Campground or another campsite of a similar standard.

Potter Gorge Campground

Potter Gorge is a hidden gem nestled deep within Wellington National Park, embraced by towering jarrah and marri trees. Just a short walk from camp lies the Wellington Dam, where gentle breezes ripple across the water and birdsong fills the air. This is a place where time slows down — a true retreat from city life.

Facilities here are simple but well maintained: clean toilets, picnic tables, fire rings, and open spaces perfect for relaxing under the canopy. At night, with no light pollution, the Milky Way reveals itself in full splendour, and the soft crackle of the campfire becomes the soundtrack of the evening.

Wagyu Barbecue Feast

Dinner on the first night is a Wagyu BBQ feast under the stars, prepared and enjoyed together by the fire. Ingredients and condiments are provided by us, so all you need to bring is your appetite and spirit of adventure.

The joy of camping isn't just in the scenery it's in the shared laughter, the smoky aroma of the grill, and the sparkle of the stars above.





DAY 2

Forest Awakening & Lake of Wonders



Wake up to birdsongs and fresh forest air. Wake up to the sound of birdsong and the first light peeking through the trees.

Enjoy a hearty campsite breakfast prepared together, perhaps also with the sound of a nearby river or the gentle rustling of leaves overhead.

After breakfast, you can take a light stroll to explore the natural surroundings — maybe spotting kangaroos, kookaburras, or colourful parrots in their habitat.





Lake Cave Discovery

Next, we journey to the mystical Lake Cave, hidden beneath ancient karri forest. As one of the most enchanting limestone caves in the Margaret River region.

Descend 325 steps into a cool, mirror-like chamber where stalactites hang like chandeliers and the famous Suspended Table seems to float above the still water. This breathtaking natural wonder is one of Australia's most photogenic caves.



Margaret River Wine Region

We then visit a renowned winery in Margaret River, where vines stretch over gentle hills and the air is scented with eucalyptus and grape leaves.

Enjoy lunch amid the vineyards. For those interested, you can (self-finance) a wine tasting to experience Margaret River's famous cabernet sauvignon and chardonnay.



light bushcraft

In the afternoon, we'll return to the campsite for a slower, more personal pace. This is your time to truly connect with the forest. Guests are free to relax under the shade of jarrah and marri trees, explore the nearby trails, or join our guide in light bushcraft activities — simple, beginner-friendly skills that bring you closer to nature.

You might also choose to unwind by the lake, read a book in the fresh air, or chat with fellow travellers as the afternoon sun softens through the trees. As the forest grows quieter, a warm sense of calm settles over the camp — a rare kind of peace that modern life often forgets.



Self-Cooking at Camp

As the evening approaches, everyone will prepare and cook their own dinner using the provided ingredients and camping equipment — a hands-on and fun way to truly experience outdoor living.

After dinner, gather once more around the campfire. With the forest as your backdrop and the stars above, it's a moment of peaceful connection with nature that few get to experience.







DAY 3

Morning Lights & Farewell to the Wild

Morning Forest Farewell

The final morning greets you with soft sunlight and the quiet charm of the bush.

After a self-prepared breakfast at the campsite, we'll pack up our gear, making sure to leave no trace behind.

On the way back to Perth, we'll stop for a relaxed brunch at a local café (own expense), the perfect way to wind down the trip.

Return Journey

We'll return to Perth CBD in the afternoon, bringing this refreshing camping adventure to a close — but the memories of starry skies, campfire warmth, and hands-on experiences will last much longer.

POTTER GORGE CAMPGROUND

A peaceful site nestled within Wellington National Park. Surrounded by jarrah and marri trees, this campground offers a unique balance of wilderness and tranquility.

At night, the forest falls silent and the stars take over the sky. With no city lights nearby, the Milky Way shines in dazzling clarity — a view that stays in your memory long after the trip ends. The nearby Wellington Dam is just a short walk away, perfect for an evening stroll or a quiet sunrise moment.
